Celebrating 10 Years of a Landmark Neighbourhood

More than a decade, more than just a development

It's hard to believe Polaris 3083 is over ten years old! Widely acclaimed as a leading example of urban renewal in Melbourne's inner north, Polaris celebrates a more than a decade in which the once–neglected 26 acre site has been utterly transformed into a thriving urban precinct with a dynamic town centre, surrounded by diverse residential architecture and green open space.

Recognising one of the last remaining infill opportunities of inner Melbourne back in 2008, developer DealCorp purchased the site from the State Government and worked closely with the City Of Darebin and project architects ClarkeHopkinsClarke (CHC), commencing works in 2010. Over ten years later, Polaris 3083 is now home to over 1000 residents and the retail hub is a popular destination for the wider northern community.

DealCorp Executive Chairman, David Kobritz commented, "From purchasing the site to walking around today and seeing what has been established is remarkable. The shops, cafes, restaurants and other retail is a hub of activity and excitment. Anchored by neighboring La Trobe University, the site is a modern, thriving example of how careful planning and thorough execution can create something which will be enjoyed for decades to come. It truly is a landmark project which we are very proud to have developed."

Critical to the vision of a genuine, connected community was the 'heart and soul of Polaris'—a town centre completed in stage one that delivered one of Victoria's first examples of 'main street' master-planning.

Urban Design Partner Dean Landy from architects CHC reflected: 'In our experience, the best town centre design draws on the lessons of the great pre-war planning era, as you see in Yarraville, Elwood and East Ivanhoe... What differentiates a new local town centre from just another shopping centre is



a sense of place and character.' The success of Polaris has been widely recognised, attracting major retailers from the outset with Woolworths, Chemist Warehouse and Dan Murphy's as anchor tenants and going on to receive the 2016 UDIA Excellence Award for Urban Renewal and the 2017 UDIA Environmental Excellence Award.

CHC's Toby Lauchlan said, 'Polaris has been a rewarding experience for us and we wanted to ensure we left a great legacy for residents.' There is a strong sense from everyone involved with Polaris' ten year journey that they have been a part of creating something special. Traffic engineer James Brownlie declared, 'There is an immense pleasure in watching a project grow and evolve – seeing it come to life from plans on paper to people living their lives in the streets.'

Lunar Construction Now Complete

Located at the northern tip of the Polaris 3083 precinct, Lunar Apartments and Townhouses complete one of the final pieces of this unique project.

Just two minutes walk from a flourishing shopping and dining hub in the Polaris town centre, the Lunar residences enjoy a peaceful, secluded atmosphere. One, two & three bedroom apartments over a four levels set among the treetops have already sold to many locals, first home owners and downsizers. The townhouse architecture by multi-award-winning Clarke-HopkinsClarke focuses on premium quality and modern functionality.

Light-filled living with distinctly upmarket finishes and luxury inclusions exude a timeless style, combining with a thoughtful emphasis on ample storage, natural ventilation and secure living. CHC's Toby Lauchlan describes creating the final instalment of a project as being 'like writing the closing chapters of a book, so we wanted to make an impact'. He adds, 'The idea of apartment living isn't small, cramped spaces, but large, open living areas and lovely vistas. Architecturally our language was simple – structured forms and layered interest through angled roof forms and natural materials, with a strong connection to the local vernacular.'
